2015 Board/Operational Report

2015 was a year of change and development. The Organisational Review was the catalyst for much of this change which saw the appointment of a General Manger, the formalising of many of the Society's procedures, the introduction of benchmarking and best practice initiatives, and the creation of our Vision, Values and Strategic Aims which provide us with a framework for the future.

This report cannot attempt to encapsulate the whole year. It is a summary of key facts and figures that we trust will be of interest to the Society's Members.

2. Welfare

642 rescues in 2015 - this figure is as accurate as possible because the auditing process developed through 2015.

Welfare complaints topped 222 by the end of December 2015, compared to 186 for 2014. Included in this final figure are approximately 10% of cases that needed robust action by way of Police/Authority intervention.

Feral cats continued to require attention, with sizeable populations in Douglas, Port Erin, Ramsey and Andreas. In the latter area more than 40 cats had set up home in scrap vehicles and hedgerows, and all were trapped, neutered returned to a different location where they were monitored whilst they settled in.

In 2015 there has been a greater emphasis on moving from a reactive response to complaints to a proactive approach to early intervention, education and assistance. Most cases of neglect occur as a result of an owner's financial hardship or simply not understanding their animal's needs.

The Welfare team have worked closely with other agencies including the Police, the Probation Service, DEFA and the Department of Health and Social Care.

Overall stay for a majority of dogs brought in as strays was one day or less.

Each dog that enters the Kennels is automatically charged a boarding fee £15.00.

We receive £6,706.40 per year for providing kennelling for stray dogs, and £9,807.60 per year for providing coverage for out of hours (5pm - 8pm and 5pm and 5pm

The contract runs from the 1st July 2014 for three years.

4. Capital Projects

<u>Aviary</u>: using RSPCA standards, and professional advice, the Aviary was re-modelled with better drainage, improved flooring, and specialist equipment such as an incubator. This has greatly improved the rate of attrition and given wild birds a much better chance of survival.

<u>Cattery Quarantine and Isolation Unit</u>: this building has been completely refurbished, with easy to clean, well-ventilated pens that contain pods for cats to sleep in, ramps and a small exercise area. The treatment room is also much improved with better storage and flooring. Infection rates have improved, and cats are better able to move to the main Cattery after their two week quarantine period.

<u>Sensory Garden</u>: the dogs in our Kennels have an additional outdoor 'enrichment space' to roam in thanks to Pokerstars who helped to fund and construct the garden, with its scented plants, sand pit and play area.
